

### SPOTLIGHT ON TOM AND JACK



Jack and I both are both Stock Assistants, our jobs are important because we help the Community Nursing Team, who provide healthcare to Hull and the East Riding of Yorkshire.

Our job tasks include doing daily stock counts and boot boxes (boxes of wound care that the nurses keep in their car boots). We also bring in deliveries and unpack them, ticking them off on the delivery notes to know if there are products missing or not.

We both keep others safe by safely using our box-cutters, getting rid of access waste that could cause slips or trips, and making sure that products are safely placed on the shelves.

We also do a few admin tasks, such as scanning drug charts and organising information packs for patients. At one our our placements, we also do Enhanced Flushing Records, where we walk around and check the flow of water dispensers for 3 minutes, this is to minimise the risk of Legionnaire's disease.

We both perform physical jobs and organize things, which is the sort of jobs we like.


